stty, gtty - set and retrieve the modes of a terminal

SYNOPSIS

int stty (fildes, arg)

DESCRIPTION

Stty and gtty are used to set and get various characteristics of a character device referred to by fildes. Fildes usually refers to a device associated with a typewriter, but may also refer to certain special devices such as named pipes. The second argument, arg, should be a pointer to the sgttyb structure defined in the include file < sgtty.h>.

NOTE

Stty and gtty are now obsolete, having been replaced with the newer *ioctl* command. These routines merely call *ioctl* with the command requests **IOCSETP** and **TIOCGETP**. *Ioctl* should be used for all new code.
